In 1875, during the ravages of the cholera, great solemnity pervaded the community. More than 100 were added to the churches as the fruit of that awakening. In 1890 the number of communicants in the three churches was 1,487; of pupils in the Sabbath-schools, 1,550; of pupils in the day-schools, 848.
